

Nurses On Boards Coalition

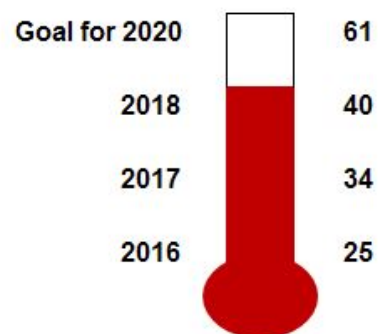


The Nurses on Boards Coalition (NOBC) represents national and state efforts by nurses and others working to build healthier communities in America. NOBC's mission is to improve the health of communities and the nation through the service of nurses on boards and other governing bodies. The goal is to get at least 10,000 nurses on boards by 2020 while raising awareness that all boards can benefit from the unique perspective of having nurses on their boards. NAC's Executive Director served on the national NOBC advisory board from 2015 – 2016.

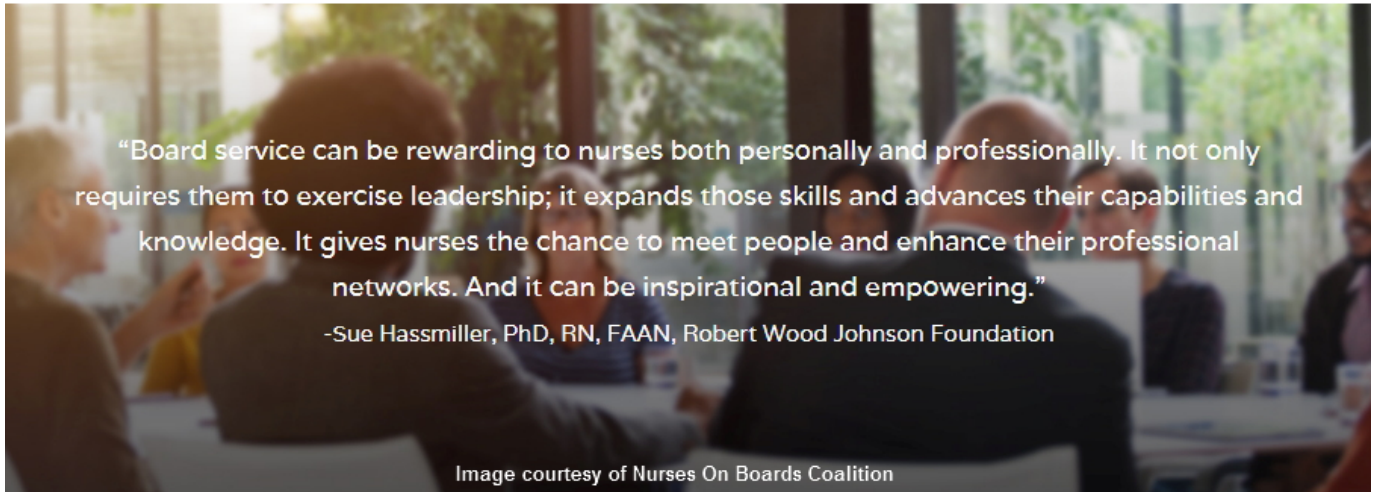
NE's contribution toward NOBC goal
